A TROPHY, A STORY, A REFERENCE

The Yennenga Stallion is the symbol of supreme consecration to a cinematographic work in the official selection. It is represented by a woman warrior, perched on the back of a rearing horse, holding a spear.

The trophy derives its meaning from the founding myth of the Mossé Empire, the largest ethnic group in Burkina Faso.

According to legend, the Gambaga King had many daughters and no heir. Obeying an ancient custom, he outlawed marriage for his eldest daughter Yennenga. Instead of being a wife, she is entrusted the role of Princess of War, and had to head an army which task is to wage war to the faraway territories. She grudgingly renounced marriage.

During a fight, however, her horse runaway and took her very far from home. She got lost and met with Rialé, a solitary hunter, who gave her aid. Yennenga fell in love with Rialé and remained with him.

They had a son, the Great hero Ouedraogo meaning male horse. Ouedraogo is the founder of the Mossé Empire.

Beyond the prize, the Yennenga Stallion symbolizes Africa's cultural identity, which filmmakers should keep alive through their creations.

Since ever 1972 when the competition was institutionalized at FESPACO, the Yennenga Stallion was awarded to 22 films. With an initial cash value of CFA 10,000,000 the prize has recently increased to CFA 20,000,000 or Euro 30,490.
